### Interpretation Example:

For a score of 6: Compared to other adult male sexual offenders, Mr. \_\_\_\_\_'s score falls into the 77.0 to 86.8 percentile. This percentile means that 77.0 to 86.8 % of sex offenders scored at or below Mr. \_\_\_\_\_'s score. Conversely, 13.2 to 23.0% of sex offenders scored higher.
